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PROMOTING MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS AMONGST YOUTH IN SOUTH EAST South East CDC's Resilience Committee and T:>Works produces a mental wellness film and animation to generate constructive conversations and help seeking behaviours

Singapore, 25 April 2022 – With the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, many youth are experiencing increased anxiety due to disruption to their academic routines and reduced social interactions with their friends. In response to this, South East Community Development Council's (CDC) Resilience Committee partnered with T:>Works to bring *The Light Within* to schools in the South East District (more details on South East CDC's Committees in Annex A), to raise awareness and reduce stigma on mental health among students. Earlier today, students from ITE College East were the first batch who watched the short film, 'Sensitive', with a discussion led by their lecturers thereafter. The lecturers had gone through specially designed workshop prior the launch to effectively facilitate fruitful conversations with their students.

The Light Within is a mental wellness digital series which comprises a short film titled 'Sensitive' and an animation titled 'Sleepover'. Coupled with the digital productions, a workshop and an educational kit are what teachers and lecturers will experience and have as resources to enhance the process of interactions with their students. *The Light Within* not only aims to empower teachers and lecturers with capabilities, tools, and resources to facilitate conversations on related themes to the digital productions but also open discussions on mental health issues.

Earlier today, *The Light Within* was launched by Mr Fahmi Aliman, Mayor of South East district at ITE College East. Mayor Fahmi highlighted, "South East CDC partnered with T:>Works to thoughtfully produce The Light Within with the purpose of promoting mental health and well-being amongst students and educators in secondary schools and tertiary institutions within the South East District. This is important as the pandemic has caused disruptions to everyone especially students' daily lives, resulting in an increasing amount of mental health issues. By working with schools to reach out to educators and through them, we hope to strengthen the students' mental resilience, encourage peer support and highlight available resources within the community."

Similarly, Traslin Ong, Executive Director of T:>Works said "The rise in the rates of mental health issues among youths is concerning. It is critical to address the youths' psychological well-being to help them thrive in their transition from adolescence into adulthood. We believe educators will also experience stress as they work with their charge to navigate the

journey of growing up; and teachers, counsellors and youth workers may need more help and strategies to discuss this sensitive subject. The aim of this project is to raise awareness, remove stigma and promote mental well-being amongst youth by creating conversations about mental health through the use of digital productions. T:>Works is proud to partner with South East CDC to gather a group of creative team equipped to design and produce The Light Within, which places the youths at the heart of the narrative and unpacks multiple perspectives around mental health."
